### Some factors to choose your destination

### Culture of the country/region





### **Academic Fit**

Ensure that the host institution offers courses that align with your academic goals and interests. Check the course offerings, faculty expertise, and any special programs that might enhance your studies. Each university may have different leading educational fields. Take a careful consideration into the courses that you may register in partner university and its credit transfer policy.



### Language

The partner university may not deliver all courses in English, and if you are proficient in a particular language, studying in a country where it is spoken can be a valuable opportunity to improve your language skills. Alternatively, if you prefer to study in English, choose a destination where English is widely used.



### Location

The location of the host country can influence your overall experience. Decide if you prefer to study in a big city, a small town, or a rural area. Consider the climate and proximity to other countries or regions for travel opportunities.

### **Cost of Living**

Research the cost of living in the host country and city, check the factsheet from partner university or OSEP sharepoint. Make sure it fits within your budget, including accommodation, transportation, food, and other daily expenses. The cost of living and travel expenses vary depending on the country.



### **Safety and Stability**

Check the safety and political stability of the destination. Review travel advisories and government websites for up-to-date information on the host country's safety conditions.

### **Scholarship and Funding Opportunities**

Consider any available scholarships or funding opportunities for studying in specific countries. Financial assistance can significantly impact your decision.

### **Support Services**

Reach out to former exchange students who have studied in your potential destinations. They can provide valuable insights into their experiences and offer tips for a successful exchange

### **Visa and Immigration Requirements:**

Research the potential networking and research/internship/career opportunities in the host country or connections to local industries.

### Number of exchange slots available

- 1. If the number of exchange slots is limited, there may be higher competition among students from VinUni to secure a spot in a particular destination. This can lead to a more competitive selection process.
- 2. Priority Destinations: Some popular or prestigious destinations or destinations with scholarship support will have a limited number of exchange slots available. Students may need to prioritize other destinations based on their academic interests, career goals, or personal preferences.

### **Elibility**

- Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 are all eligible to apply for Outbound Student Exchange for Spring 2025. If you were previously not nominated for the current batch, you can continue to apply for next batches for the Spring 2025 semester.
- Exchange semester:
  - Fall semester

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- Summer semester
- Spring semester

### Minimum requirements

- Currently be an active full time student at VinUni
- Have completed at least 2 academic semesters at VinUni prior to the OSEP and after the OSEP have at least one academic semester remaining at VinUni before graduation.
- Have no major disciplinary action (Level 3 and up) pending at the time of application submission.
- Have a minimum of 2.5 CGPA (cumulative grade point average) at the point of application and meet the minimum academic requirements by the host university.
- Have an account of good financial standing at VinUni.
  - Meet all the minimum requirements including the language requirements set by the host institutions. Please note that the minimum requirements from the host universities may vary from those of VinUni.



### Notes:

When being nominated for the partner universities, students may have to submit additional documents as required by different host universities such as a letter of recommendation, apostille transcripts, certificate of enrollment, bank statement.

The exchange student must complete all necessary application procedures before the deadlines provided by the partner university. If you need to send any documents to the partner university, kindly submit them to the partner university directly for international shipping prior to the specified deadline.

# **Application steps** Submit the application documents (Outbound Student Exchange Program Application Portal): https://vinuni.force.com/s/login/ Application evaluation VinUni Review by the Committee. Announcement of evaluation results by VinUni. GEO sends VinUni nominated students' application dossiers to partner institutions for assessment. The partner university reviews the nominations, sends students application guideline. The partner university makes the final decision and issues the Letter of Acceptance to the successful students.

# Research exchange programs #1

Research your target university: Thoroughly research the universities or institutions you are interested in for the exchange program that align with your interests and goals. Consider factors such as program duration, the destination country, the academic offerings, living expense, culture, and any specific projects or initiatives that resonate with your Check website interests. and of VinUni Global sharepoint Exchange of our partner universities for further information.

### Seek for information

Participate in study abroad fairs and information sessions organized by your university or other institutions. These events often bring together program representatives, alumni, and experts who can provide valuable insights and answer your questions about specific exchange programs.

# **#2** Reflect on your goals

Take some time to reflect on your personal and academic goals, and how the Global Exchange Program aligns with you. Clearly articulating your motivations and objectives can help you present a compelling case in your application.

## #4 Connect

Seek out and connect with students who have previously participated in the exchange program you're interested in. They can share their first-hand experiences, tips, and advice. Consider reaching out to them through social media, university forums, or alumni networks to gain valuable insights.

- Showcase your adaptability, cross-cultural communication skills, and ability to contribute to a diverse environment.
- Emphasize how the program will contribute to your personal and professional growth, and how you can contribute to the host institution.

# #6 Letter of Recommendation

Request recommendation letters (if required) from professors, advisors, or mentors who can speak to your academic abilities, character, and potential. Choose individuals who can provide specific examples and insights into your strengths.

# Be an ambassador #7

Doing an exchange not only gives you the chance to expose to other cultures, but it also gives you the chance to be a representative of our university and our nation. "Exchange" not only means "to receive", but it also means "to give". Keep this in mind and be the ambassador for our university and our country.

### **Roles and Responsibilities**

### 1. STUDENT APPLICANT

- Research university of choice, suitable program, courses
- Find out more about the university, cost of living, visa requirements, air fares, accommodation as well as travel and medical healthcare insurance.
- Discuss with your Program Director on your study plan.
- Apply for your Student Visa promptly after receiving the offer letter from partner university.
- Follow terms and conditions of Outbound Student Exchange Programs, VinUni regulations, policies.
- Follow rules, regulations of host country and host university.

### 2. GLOBAL EXCHANGE OFFFICE

- Provide updated information on available universities for Global Exchange Programs. Liaise with the Partner University on nomination.
- Provide guidance to students on the preparation needed for their Global Exchange Programs including advisory on partner universities, application process to host university, cost of living, visa requirements, travel and medical healthcare insurance and matters pertaining to safety.
- Announce information about outbound exchange programs including description of the eligibility requirements for each VinUni's partner institution.
- Be responsible for transmitting information about selected students participating in outbound exchange programs to the receiving institution, maintaining contact with them throughout the exchange period.
- Make sure that students are appropriately prepared for their student exchange.
- Work out appropriate mechanisms with partner universities to confirm that exchanges have been completed satisfactorily.
- Provide supporting documents to students on the preparation needed for their Global Exchange Program where necessary.
- Prepare Decision for students to study abroad.
- Coordinate pre-departure support for students.
- Ensure that there are appropriate procedures in place for re-orientation on return to VinUni where appropriate.

### 3. OFFFICE OF PLANNING AND REGISTRAR

- Provide advisory on credit transfer to be undertaken at the host university.
- Be the central coordinating office for all exchange credit transfer applications or related-academic issues for students. All inquiries and applications regarding credit transfer should be submitted to the Registrar.
- Issue Certificate of Enrollment, Official transcripts, Letter of Recommendation, etc. for students to apply for visa.
- Collect and proceed with Study Plan and Credit Transfer Approval Form by the end of their first four weeks at the host institution, Credit Transfer Form and Official Transcript after students complete their program.

### 4. COLLEGES/FACULTY

- Approve the student's course list for semester exchange and provide guidance on the course selection.
- Provide advisory on study plan and complementary studies selected by students.
- Approve the Study Plan and Credit Transfer Pre-Approval Form (if applicable)/Learning Agreement, credit transfer form.
- Map the core course/electives for the Exchange Program and resolve any course mapping issues that may arise.

### **Roles and Responsibilities**

### **5. REVIEW COMMITTEE**

- Finalize the nominations and if applicable, financial support with members of the committee during their deliberations; adhere to all applicable guidelines and regulations regarding conflicts of interest and application privacy/confidentiality.
- The committee members include Vice Provost; Global Exchange Office; Registrar, College/Faculty representatives and other invited stakeholders (if needed).

### **Selection and Nomination**

- The applicant's academic performance (transcript), language proficiency, CV, study plan, personal statement, etc., will be thoroughly assessed as part of the application process.
- The selection of the partner university for study will be based on the ranking of the overall
  evaluation score derived from the submitted documents.

### Notes:

- Admission to partner universities is not guaranteed for the nominated student as it is the host university's decision.
- The nominated student is not allowed to defer enrollment to the next academic year or reserve their qualification. If the student cannot attend the partner universities on time, their qualification will be immediately canceled.
- Review Committee retains the right to reassign the nominated student to study at another university on special cases imposed by the partner universities.

### **Choosing courses**

### Review courses available at the host institution

Check out the course information from the websites of host institutions before deciding the exchange venue choices, to ensure that there are suitable courses for you to take. It is quite often that certain courses offered by partner institutions may not be open each term, or certain courses may not be opened to exchange students.

# Review VinUni's policy on credit transfer and course equivalence

There is no automatic credit transfer, and students must submit a credit transfer application upon completion of the exchange studies for evaluation and approval.

### Discuss the study plan with the faculty advisor and/or the Program Director

This advisory process is important to ensure that students are taking appropriate courses, in the sense that they fulfill the graduation requirements. It would be useful for students to review their major program requirements before seeking advice.

# Apply for course mapping to the Office of University Registrar at VinUni

If there is no course equivalence information, students should request for course assessment by submitting the application to the Office of University Registrar. There may be credit system differences between VinUni and the host institution, and the credit conversion adopted by VinUni.

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### Select courses

Choosing your courses before departing for a student exchange program is a crucial step to ensure a smooth transition and maximize your learning experience. Here are some steps to help you finalize your courses.

- Communicate with VinUni: Stay in touch with College & Registrar. They will provide guidance on the courses you need to take and any specific requirements for your exchange program.
- Review Course Offerings: Obtain a list of available courses at your host university. Many universities publish course catalogs or offer information online. Take time to research the course descriptions, prerequisites, and credit values.
- Check Credit Transfer: Confirm with College how the credits earned during the exchange will transfer back to your academic program. Ensure that the courses you plan to take abroad will count towards your degree requirements.
- Discuss with PD/Academic Advisors: Consult your academic advisor or departmental advisor to discuss your course choices. They can guide you on selecting courses that align with your academic goals and help you stay on track with your major or minor requirements.
- Flexibility and Alternatives: Be prepared for the possibility that some courses you want may not be available or may overlap in scheduling. Have backup course options in mind to ensure you can build a suitable schedule.
- Language Considerations: If you are going to a country with a different language, check if there are courses taught in English or in a language you are proficient in. Language courses can also be a valuable addition to your exchange program.
- Balance Your Course Load: Consider the workload and difficulty level of the courses you plan to take. Studying abroad can be exciting, but it's essential to maintain a balance between academics and exploring your host country.
- Cultural Immersion Courses: Look for courses that offer insights into the local culture, history, or society. These courses can enhance your understanding of your host country and make your experience even more enriching.
- Pre-Approval and Documentation: Seek pre-approval from VinUni for the courses you plan to take abroad. Keep all necessary documentation, such as course syllabi and descriptions, for credit transfer purposes.

### **Pre Departure Check list**

### PRE-DEPARTURE CHECKLIST FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

It is crucial to adequately prepare yourself for your study abroad experience. This checklist serves as a reminder of all the essential steps you need to take before the commencement of your exchange program..

# Please make sure that your passport will be valid for at least six months after you depart for your partner university. Please renew or apply for a new passport as soon as possible and in time for the visa application process. Visa Upon receiving the acceptance letter for enrollment, it is important to promptly contact the nearest embassy or consulate of your host country to begin the visa application procedure. Please ensure to check the processing time required to obtain your visa. It is important to note that each nationality has different processes and procedures for obtaining a student visa, and these can change frequently. VinUni will NOT apply for the student's visa on your behalf. We recommend that you regularly check the embassy or consulate website for updated information. You will need to make a student visa application checklist and make sure that your passport will be valid for at least six months after you depart for your host

### **Travel and Health Insurance**

Every exchange student must obtain and maintain a valid Travel and Medical Healthcare Insurance. The host university will provide detailed information and requirements during the pre-departure process. It's essential to be aware that some partner universities in certain countries may require you to purchase medical and health insurance directly from them. The specific prices for such insurance may vary at each university, and you will receive this information after applying. As an exchange student, you will be responsible for covering the costs associated with these compulsory insurance requirements at the host university.

university. Since it is a multi-step procedure, please be proactive in conducting extensive research and prepare the required documents for visa application as soon as possible. It is the students' responsibility in obtaining the visa for their

exchange program abroad. For visa-related inquiries, please contact the Embassy of the host country in Vietnam.

### Accommodation

You are responsible for arranging your accommodation during the exchange program. You have the option to choose between living on campus or off-campus but consider essential factors such as your social networks and travel time to and from campus when making this decision. Pricing of the accommodation is usually a crucial aspect for exchange students, and having a trusted same-gender roommate can help reduce overall costs. Your host university will generally provide information about accommodation, so be sure to carefully review the application details and deadlines related to housing. Additionally, reaching out to exchange alumni for advice on finding housing can be beneficial. They may offer valuable insights and recommendations based on their own experiences, helping you make choice about your accommodation during the exchange program.

### Flight tickets

You can consider to purchase your flight tickets once you receive official acceptance from your host university or visa approval, have your study plan approved, and obtain the relevant student's visa. We recommend purchasing flexible tickets in the event that you need to reschedule your travel dates. Check your visa dates, semester and holiday dates before making a reservation.

### Familiarity with your new destination

There are several ways to familiarize yourself with your travel destination, including:

- Engaging with alumni from past Student Exchange Programs to gain insights and tips.
- Exploring their Social Media pages to get a glimpse of the destination.
- · Reviewing the information pack provided by the partner universities for valuable details.
- Connecting with international buddies from the host university to get first-hand advice and recommendations.
- Checking out the government websites of host country for safety and travel advice.
- Utilizing various apps like Trip Advisor, Smart Traveler, etc for local travel tips. These apps can provide information on local transportation, currency, weather, places of interest, and general Dos and Don'ts suitable for the local environment
- Learning some local language phrases to facilitate adaptation and communication during your stay.
- It is essential to review the documents required for entry into the host country. You may be required to provide these items upon arrival. Prepare for your move to a new country by following instructions and guideline from the host university including but not limited to entry requirements, culture, weather, food, lifestyle etc. so that you can go prepared

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### **Pre Departure Check list**

# Pre-Departure Orientation

Pre-departure orientation for exchange students is compulsory to attend prior to your departure. This session provides students with comprehensive information and guidance before you embark on their study abroad journey and prepare students for their exchange experience, helping them make a smooth transition to the host country and university. The briefing will cover various topics such as:

- Overview and Introduction of Outbound Student
- Life as an international student: "Survive first, Thrive later"
- Sharing from VinUni exchange alumni
- Academic requirements and expectations during the exchange semester

### Prepare several necessities including but not limited to:

- Medicine: Bring along any prescription medications you require, as well as a basic first-aid kit with essentials like bandaids, pain relievers, antiseptic wipes, Panadol, berberine and any specific medications you may need during your stay.
- Clothing: Pack appropriate clothing for the climate and seasons of your host country. Consider cultural norms and dress codes when selecting your wardrobe. Don't forget essential items such as socks, and comfortable walking shoes.
- Electricity Cable: Bring an adapter or voltage converter to ensure your electronic devices can be used in the host country's power outlets. This will allow you to charge your phone, laptop, and other devices without any issues.
- Personal Care Items: Include personal hygiene items like toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, soap, and any other essentials you might need.
- Travel Documents: Ensure you have all necessary travel documents, including your passport, student visa, acceptance letter from the host university, and any other important paperwork.
- Money and Currency: Inform your bank about your travel plans and carrying certain amount of the local currency for expenses during the exchange program.
- Important Contact Information: Keep a list of important contact numbers, including the address and phone number of
  your host university, emergency contacts, and the nearest embassy or consulate.
- Important Information in Digital Format: Scan or photocopy important documents like your passport, visa, and insurance policies, and keep them in a secure digital format in case of emergencies.
- Books and Study Materials: If you need specific textbooks or reference materials for your studies, check if they are
  available in your host country. E-books or digital copies may be more convenient to carry.
- Language Aids: If the primary language in your host country is different from your native language, carry a pocket dictionary or language-learning apps to help you communicate.
- Personal Items: Bring a few personal mementos from home, such as photos or small gifts from friends and family. These can provide comfort during moments of homesickness
- Travel Comfort: Consider bringing a neck pillow, eye mask, earplugs, skin care and a blanket for long flights or train journeys. Comfortable clothing for travel days is also essential.
- Souvenirs: Leave some space in your luggage for souvenirs or items you might acquire during your exchange program to promote VinUni, Vietnam.

### **Packaging**

- Understand the rules and restrictions related to packing, luggage size, and weight limits.
- Don't overpack; focus on versatile pieces that can be mixed and matched. Remember to include formal attire for special occasions or university events.
- Don't forget items like a sturdy backpack or daypack for excursions, a reusable water bottle, travel umbrella, and a lock for your luggage.

### Study Plan and Credit Transfer Pre-Approval Form

Submit the hard copy of Study Plan and Credit Transfer Pre-Approval form and the Acceptance Letter from the University Partner to the Office of Planning & Registrar. It is important to discuss your study abroad program with your Academic Advisor (or Program Director) on course (s) that you will take in the exchange semester abroad. During the exchange period, students must take courses equivalent to at least VinUni 12 credits in each regular semester.

### **Finalize courses**

Finalizing your courses before departing/within the first 4 weeks for a student exchange program is a crucial step to ensure a smooth transition and maximize your learning experience. Here are some steps to help you finalize your courses.

- Registration Process: Familiarize yourself with the course registration process and system at your host university. Ensure you know the registration dates and any specific procedures for exchange students.
- Consider Workload: Avoid overloading yourself with courses, especially during your first semester in a new country. Leave room in your schedule to adapt to a different academic environment and to participate in cultural activities.
- Be Open-Minded: While planning is essential, be open to new opportunities and unexpected courses that may catch your interest during your exchange program.
- Update College/Registrar if your final courses are different course with your original form.

Remember that the courses you take during your student exchange program can greatly impact your academic and personal growth. Take the time to plan your courses thoughtfully, but also be flexible and embrace the learning opportunities that come your way.



### Keep the exchange syllabus and materials

To support the credit transfer application upon their return to VinUni, students must present an official transcript issued by the host institution. VinUni may also require students to submit course materials, outlines, the syllabus for assessment purposes and any other relevant documents, as it deems appropriate.

### Represent VinUni, Vietnam

Always remember that you are an ambassador for VinUniversity and Vietnam. It is essential to conduct yourself in a respectful manner and show a positive image of Vietnamese students..



### **Culture shock**



To mitigate the culture shock, make new friends (especially the current Vietnamese student community in the host country) and share your feelings. You may also get to know local fellows to get acquainted more with their culture, join student clubs, and be involved in activities. After recovering from the crisis of culture shock, you will gain substantial self-development and independence.

### Sharing experience

Sharing experiences during an exchange program serves several important purposes:

- Inspiration and Motivation: When participants share their experiences, it can inspire and motivate
  others to consider similar opportunities. Hearing about the transformative impact of an exchange
  program may encourage someone to step out of their comfort zone and explore the world through
  education.
- Promoting Cultural Understanding: Sharing experiences from different cultures fosters cross-cultural understanding and empathy. It allows people to learn about traditions, customs, and lifestyles that may be different from their own, promoting tolerance and respect for diversity.
- Learning from Each Other: Participants often learn from each other's experiences. They can gain
  insights into the challenges and successes of studying abroad, discover useful tips for navigating a
  foreign environment, and exchange practical advice.
- Preparation and Guidance: For those considering an exchange program, hearing about others' experiences can provide valuable information and insights. It helps potential participants understand what to expect, how to prepare, and how to make the most of their own experience.
- Building a Supportive Community: Sharing experiences can help create a sense of community among exchange participants. It allows them to connect with others who have gone through similar experiences, fostering a support network for future students.
- Reflection and Personal Growth: Recounting one's experiences can be a form of self-reflection. It gives participants the opportunity to assess their personal growth, identify challenges they overcame, and celebrate their achievements during the program.
- Promoting the Value of International Education: Sharing positive experiences highlights the value of international education and demonstrates the importance of global learning and exchange programs in developing well-rounded individuals.

### Submit credit transfer request

Upon returning from the exchange programs, students must submit an application for credit transfer to the Office of University Registrar for approval. According to VinUni regulations, credit transfer applications must be submitted within one month after the completion of the exchange program.

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### Credits transferred to VinUni transcript

After the formal approval, the credits earned from the host institution will be reflected on students' academic transcript. Credits obtained can be transferred, while grades obtained at the host institution may or may not be transferred to VinUni, depending on the agreement on the grade equivalency between VinUni and the partner university and the curriculum's requirement.


