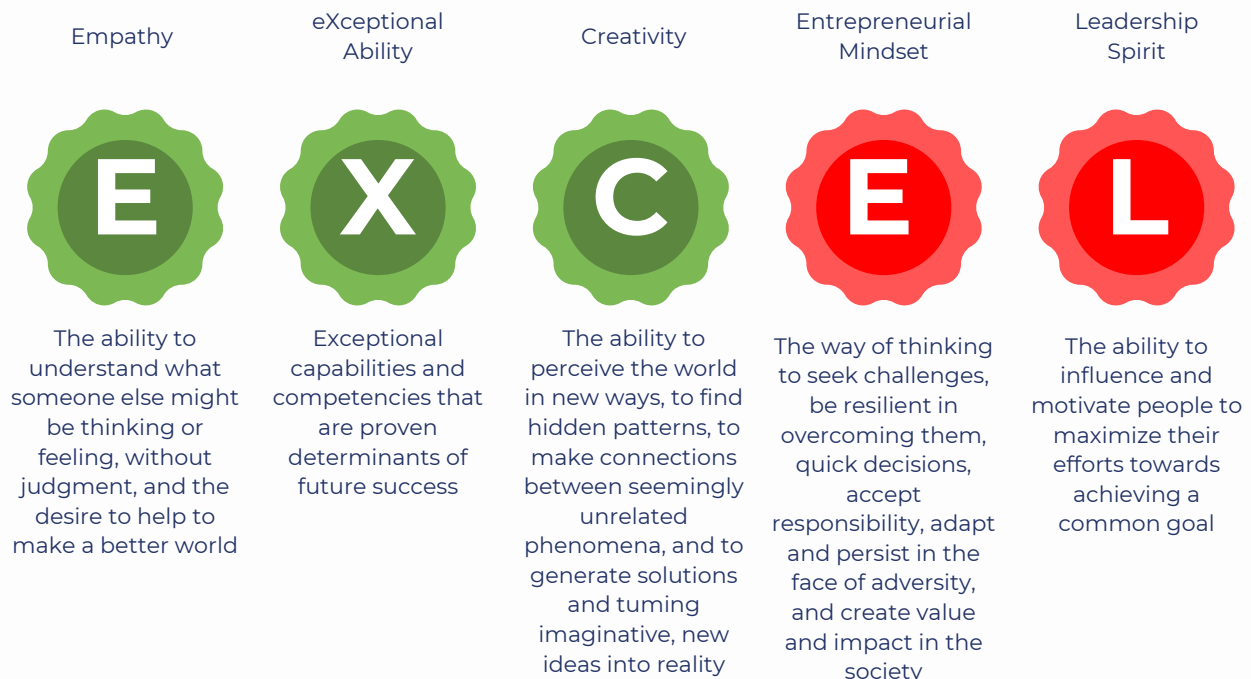

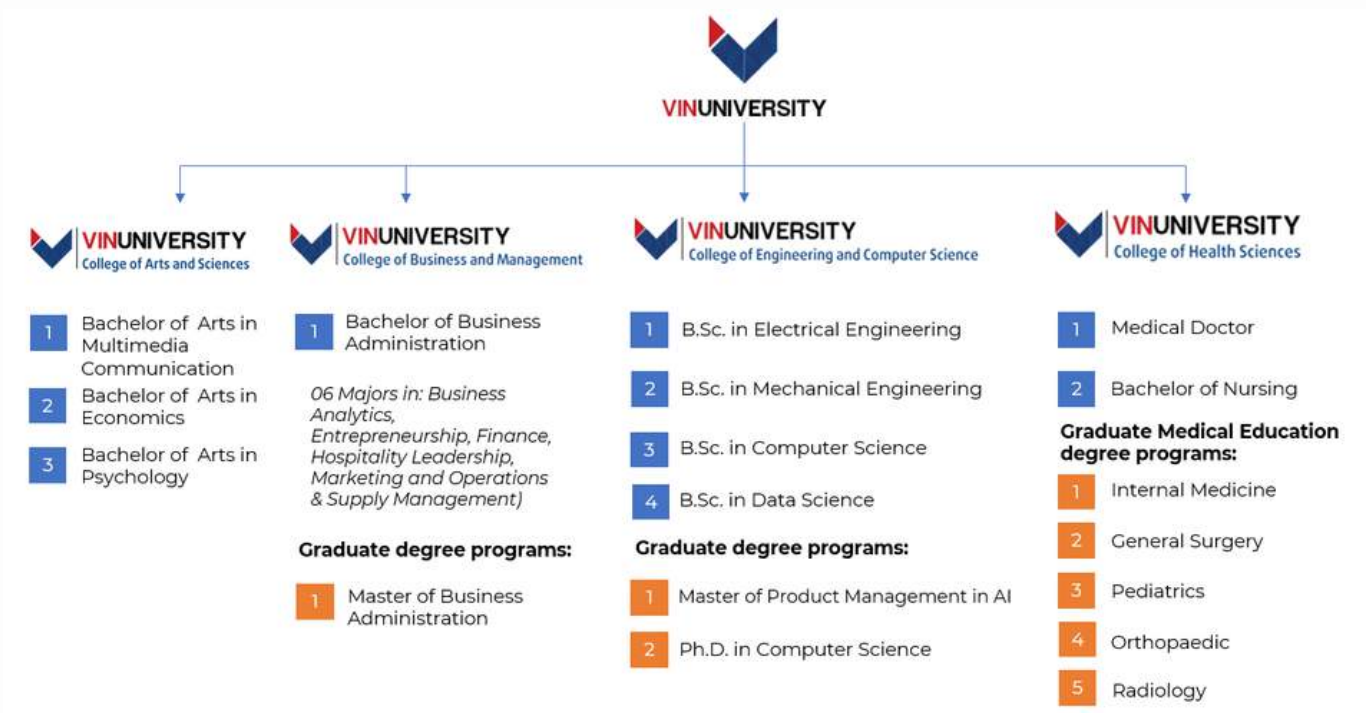
***Important Note:** The University reserves the right to change the calendar when necessary. You will need to take the initiative and responsibility to get updated regularly on the timeline via website and student portal.

4.1. Generic/Academic Advising

Generic/Academic advising is a student-centered process that allows you to reach your full academic potential and develop professional competency under the guidance of an advisor. It is a shared responsibility between you and your advisor to create a plan for your academic journey. However, you are ultimately responsible to define your academic and career goals and execute your plan to successfully achieve them.

Your Generic/Academic Advisor will support you throughout your university life and is assigned based on your major. During your first year at VinUniversity, your generic advisor will support your transition from high school to university life with your decisions to choose your classes and student organizations to join and navigate the policies and guidelines of VinUniversity. From your second year onwards, Academic Advisor will continue to help you build on the academic, co-curricular, and career goals throughout your university life.

All VinUniversity students are required to meet with their generic advisor at least once per semester in their first academic year. Your first appointment should take place before the end of the add/drop period. We will advise you on how to make an appointment with your advisor. If the advisor permits it, you may also contact your advisor directly through his/her work email.

What are your responsibilities:

Initiate contact: You are expected to initiate your contact with your Academic Advisor for scheduling, course changes, and other matters in a timely fashion. Because of their commitments to teaching, research, and other academic obligations, your academic advisor may not always be available on short notice. You are expected to plan and initiate your contact well in advance of specific deadlines. You should be well prepared for each meeting.



Keep your advisor informed:

Your Advisor can provide better advice if she/he is kept informed of your academic progress, challenges, and career goals.



Complete your Individual Development Plan (IDP): With support from your Advisor, you need to complete a goals and objectives document for your first year.



Communicate effectively:

Good advising can occur only if both you and your Academic Advisor make active efforts to develop it. Fully recognizing that your Advisor has his/her styles and personalities, you should discuss with your Advisor to find the best way to work with each other.



Academic Success

What to expect from your generic/academic advisor:



Advice: You should use your academic advisor as a resource for planning your academic program, identifying academic and career goals, and obtaining general advice on graduate degrees and careers.

Assistance and Referrals: Academic advisor may provide you with general information about and referrals to special programs such as internships, study abroad, and concurrent degrees. S/he may also help you obtain tutoring services or receive transfer/advanced placement credit, as appropriate.

Availability: You can expect to have ready access to your generic/academic advisor since most advisors set aside several hours each week for advising and allow you to make appointments outside those hours if necessary.

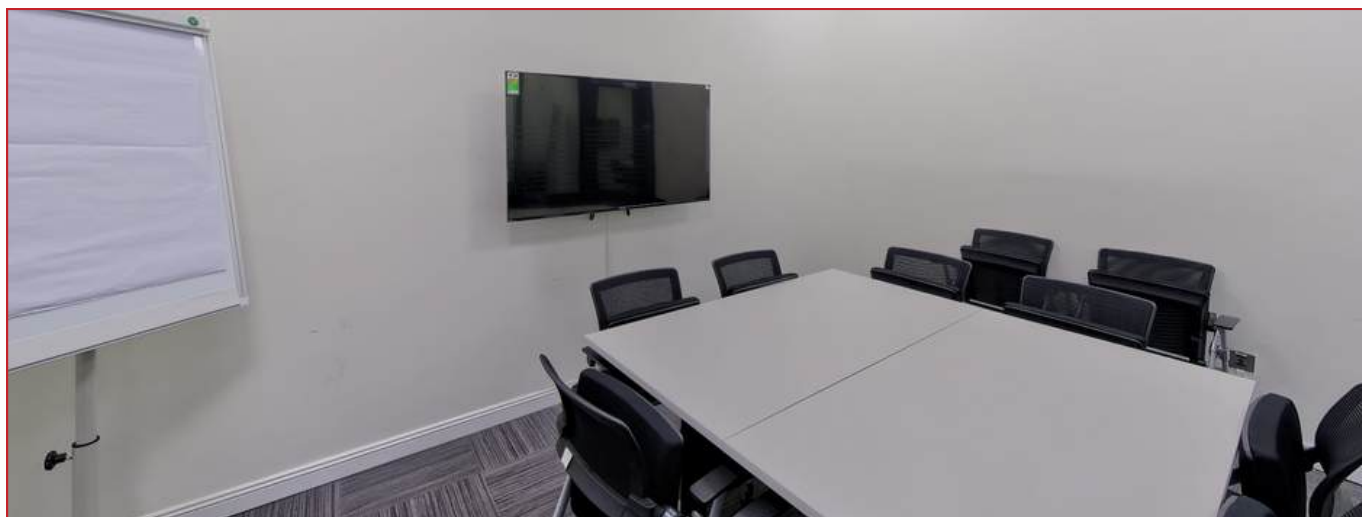


4.2. Library and Learning Resources

VinUniversity Library seeks to advance the intellectual life of the University community through resources and services that support students' successful learning outcomes and personal development.

The library, which is located on the first and the second floors of Building A, with wireless and wired internet connection, offers four main types of spaces to support learning, teaching, research, innovation, and entrepreneurial activities of library users.

- **Collaboration space:** Fully equipped, closed discussion rooms, open discussion booths, comfortable seating lounge, etc. on both floors are areas where library patrons work with one another in various group configurations to optimize their activity effectiveness. Reservation is required for the usage of closed discussion rooms in advance.



- **Sanctuary space:** Focused seats around the bookshelves on the 2nd floor are for the individuals who need a suitable quiet space for thinking, reflecting, and creating.



- **Interaction space:** For users to employ new technology, seek assistance from librarians or internal/external professional experts, and consult resources provided by the library. The library offers 2 instructional classes on the 1st floor, 2 reference service desks, 1 consultation room with an English language lab, book consulting space around bookshelves, maker innovation space, studios, teleconference rooms, PC lab with high-end computers and adaptive software. The 24/7 learning common space/room on the first floor facilitates overnight projects and studies.
- **Community space:** VinUniversity students can participate in regular activities such as talks, presentations, book discussions, exhibitions, poetry reading, etc. in the open amphitheater, and closed training rooms with a movable partition to fulfill the needs for a sense of belonging to a larger community.

Students can have access to books, journals, online databases, and more in all academic areas on-campus and even off-campus. 4.3. Learning Management System

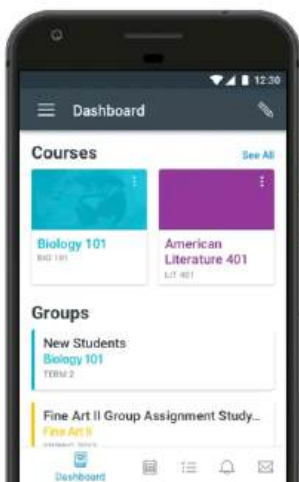
VinUniversity uses Canvas, a Learning Management System (LMS), which is a web-based software application that is used for all the VinUni for credit courses and many non-credit, informal learning opportunities as well. Canvas is used by instructors to maintain course content, schedule course events, communicate with students in the course, assign activities, assignments and quizzes, assess participation and maintain the course grades. Students are expected to login to Canvas each day to keep track of their course activities and requirements.

Canvas has many interactive features such as threaded discussions, video conferencing, Group collaborative space, and many more.

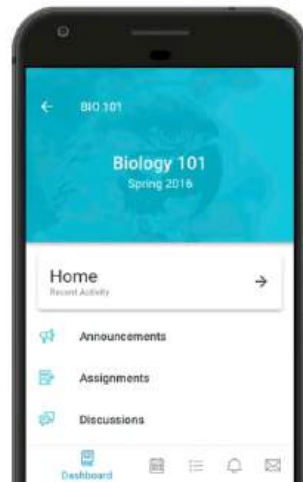

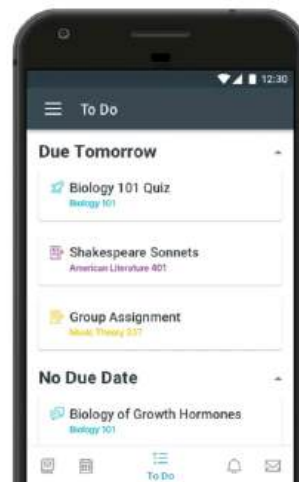

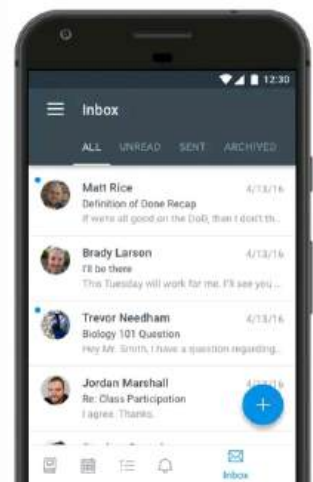

5. Academic Requirements

5.1. Academic Requirements for Graduation

Responsibility for Meeting Degree Requirements

As you would have expected, indeed it is you that is responsible for understanding the degree requirements for your major and for planning your courses of study accordingly. Your Academic Advisor shall answer your questions and advise you with your fulfillment of degree requirements. S/he will assist you in your course selection but will not be responsible for ensuring that the courses selected will meet your degree requirements. Be well prepared to take that responsibility.

Academic requirements to earn a bachelor's degree

Every undergraduate student needs to fulfill the following academic requirements:

- Complete a minimum credit requirement for the program of study.
- Complete the requirements of the General Education and English proficiency.
- Complete the requirements for your major, defined by each College.
- Clear any “I – Incomplete” marks from your record.
- Earn a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.00/4.00 (for all courses within your degree program).

You can find other requirements in the University Academic Regulations governing undergraduate studies. In consultation with your academic advisor, you will create an academic plan on the Student Portal: <https://sis.vinuni.edu.vn/> which reflects your particular interests and needs on top of requirements and expectations held in common for every undergraduate.

5.2. Time to Degree

You may wonder how long it can take to graduate from VinUniversity. The table below shows the standard and maximum time allowed to complete each program, which includes the time taken as a leave of absence:

ENTR1022 Agile Innovation and Entrepreneurship

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: None

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Explain how an entrepreneurial mindset supports and accelerates innovation and growth in the contexts of businesses, industries, and countries.
2. Evaluate the multifaceted nature of entrepreneurship in Vietnam and internationally, and how it impacts the economy, society, and environment. Have access to insights on VinGroup's governance principles (the 6 Hóa).
3. Recommend strategies to evaluate the entrepreneurial mindset, values, and behaviors, and to further develop the entrepreneurial mindset, both individually and organizationally.
4. Grow your own entrepreneurial mindset and innovation-related skills, including identifying and evaluating opportunities, taking calculated risks, solving problems creatively, communicating effectively, and influencing stakeholder groups.
5. Demonstrate the ability to work productively in teams to collaboratively explore opportunities, generate ideas, and find and communicate solutions to a predefined challenge during the course hackathon.

IDEA1010 Big Ideas

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Describe and explain a “big idea”, which may be a new solution to a problem, a disrupting technology, or an innovative method or way of doing things
2. Identify the implications of a big idea for everyday life or a professional setting
3. Develop a strategy for using a big idea to improve an existing approach or create a new application
4. Evaluate the application of a big idea, including an assessment of its positive impacts, negative impacts, and mitigating strategies for the theme of the year

LEAD1031 Leadership and Teambuilding Bootcamp

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: None

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Define foundational concepts of leadership traits, leadership styles, values, and trends, and their applications to real-life situations, especially in a turbulent world.
2. Describe and evaluate the differences and similarities between management and leadership, and their application in an organizational setting.
3. Evaluate the multifaceted nature of leadership in Vietnam and internationally, and their impact on work environments, particularly in a VUCA context. Have access to insights on Vingroup's mission, vision, and core values.
4. Develop your own leadership mindset by setting a vision, developing self-awareness, understanding others' perspectives, understanding situational contexts, communicating effectively, and making informed decisions. setting a vision, accepting accountability, understanding self and others' limits, inspiring and motivating others, and creating the collaborative conditions for success
5. Apply basic leadership values and skills through action-based learning, building self, interpersonal, and team leadership during the leadership bootcamp.

NDE1010 National Defense Education

Hours: 165

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Understand and articulate knowledge of the National Defense and Security policies of the Communist Party of Vietnam.
2. Understand basic concepts of national defense and security work.
3. Understand and practice the fundamental rules and disciplinary regulations in military organization.
4. Practice the fundamental techniques and tactics of infantry combat

LAW1010 Introduction to Law

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Explain the history, contemporary nature, and purpose of the Vietnamese legal system, including its key institutions, doctrines, and principles.
2. Describe and evaluate key differences and similarities between legal system management in Vietnam and internationally.
3. Understand the mechanisms of legal duty, justification of punishment, and the roles of courts and juries.
4. Apply fundamental legal rules and principles in a wide range of selected areas of the law, demonstrating critical thinking and ethical considerations.
5. Develop a mindset of compliance and appreciate the importance of adhering to legal standards in professional and personal context

CAS2010 Applied Ethics

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Identify and explain a range of ethical concerns across different professional and real-world domains of human interaction.
2. Apply ethical theories and offer rational justification to moral dilemmas.

MANA3021 Business Ethics

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Understand and explain the relevance of values applied to business, such as integrity, accountability, transparency, respect for stakeholders, corporate social responsibility (CSR), fairness, and compliance)
2. Identify business practices that produce unethical behavior or harm to the individual, society, or environment
3. Apply relevant ethical theories to moral dilemmas in the context of business
4. Evaluate different responses to ethical practice in business and justify an opinion based on ethical theory

NURS3240 Healthcare Ethics

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Understand and explain the relevance of principles and values applied to healthcare, medical research, and health policy, covering topics such as respect for patients, beneficence and non-maleficence, justice, and honesty and transparency)
2. Identify medical practices that produce unethical behavior or harm to patients, the profession, society, or the environment
3. Apply relevant ethical theories to moral dilemmas in the context of medical treatment
4. Evaluate different responses to ethical practice in medicine and justify an opinion based on ethical theory
5. Understand the influence of religious ethics in patient treatment and decision-making

TECH101 Technology Ethics

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Understand and explain the principles and values applied to technology, including privacy and data protection, algorithmic fairness and bias, digital inclusion, accountability and transparency, sustainability, and ethical AI and machine learning)
2. Identify uses of technology that produce unethical behavior or harm to users, society, or the environment
3. Apply relevant ethical theories to moral dilemmas involving technology
4. Evaluate different responses to ethical practice in technologies and justify an opinion based on ethical theory

COSL1010 Community Service Learning

Hours: 45

Pre-requisite: None

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Define and understand the essential components of service learning, including benefits, impact, and key attributes.
2. Critically reflect on social issues and UNESCO's sustainable development goals (SDGs) with reference to a planned service project
3. Plan and implement a service project in accordance with local laws and regulations
4. Reflect on the outcomes of that service project and how it could have been improved
5. Develop sensitivity and empathy to local community members

THINK1010 Critical and Creative Thinking

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Appreciate the purpose and importance of creative and critical thinking.
2. Identify, develop, and criticize claims and arguments in accordance with principles of logical reasoning and scientific evidence
3. Apply creative and critical thinking with supporting tools and techniques for problem-solving.
4. Embed creative and critical thinking in workplace idea generation.
5. Build foundations for enhancing individual and team effectiveness.

CECS1031 Computational Thinking

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Identify and analyze problems from life and business in order to determine computational solutions.
2. Break down problems into logical steps and data requirements.
3. Use basic data structures and algorithms for problem-solving.
4. Design simple algorithms and computational models.
5. Implement solutions using basic programming skills.
6. Evaluate and optimize computational solutions.

CECS1040 Introduction to AI Literacy

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Understand basic AI principles, including machine learning and neural networks.
2. Use AI tools like ChatGPT for work and study tasks.
3. Recognize ethical implications, such as data privacy and algorithmic bias.
4. Apply AI to improve efficiency and innovation in academic and professional settings.
5. Design and evaluate user interfaces for better human-AI interaction

ENGL1030 Academic and Professional Writing

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this unit, students will be able to:

1. Identify and explain core attitudes, values, and practices of academic culture and how academic writing reflects these.
2. Reflect critically on the differences between academic and opinion writing and apply this understanding in the composition of academic essays, including referencing, quoting, and paraphrasing.
3. Evaluate the differences between academic and professional writing in terms of style, purpose, target audience, and techniques.
4. Develop your clear, concise, and well-structured writing skills, focusing on the most critical documents and situations in academic and professional work such as academic essays, newspaper articles, business reports, proposals, speeches...
5. Use AI to develop, enhance, and revise writing in both academic and professional contexts.

ENGL1040 Interpersonal and Multimedia Communication

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: None

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Identify and explain the fundamental concepts, scope, and diversity of oral and visual communication.
2. Identify communication expectations based on an understanding of different professional audiences and contexts and apply this knowledge in delivering communication.
3. Demonstrate responsible, ethical, and respectful attitudes as the field undergoes disruptive changes fueled by rapid technological advancements.
4. Develop your own oral communication skills in key situations, from speeches to conversation, discussion, giving feedback.
5. Grow your skills in developing digital content for multimedia, including presentations, pitches, blog posts, viral videos, podcasts, and basic media management.

CBM-X Introduction to Managing Skills

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

1. Apply the SMART technique to define specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time-bound goals, ensuring clarity and focus on their objectives.
2. Develop skills to effectively organize tasks and prioritize them based on importance and urgency, facilitating efficient and systematic progress towards achieving objectives.
3. Understand how to assign tasks based on team members' individual strengths, skills, and expertise, ensuring optimal use of resources, and enhancing team performance.
4. Learn to create and manage project schedules, monitor progress, and employ motivational techniques to keep team members engaged and productive, overcoming challenges and maintaining momentum.
5. Acquire the ability to give professional, accurate, and timely feedback, fostering a positive energy and environment within the team.

4. Recognize the impact of lifestyle choices on long-term health and well-being, and make informed decisions to enhance your quality of life.

5. Acquire employment contacts leading directly to a full-time job following graduation from college.

HASS1010 Marxism Leninism Philosophy (Philosophy, Science and Society)

Credit: 3

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Understand the basic philosophical foundations of Marxism-Leninism, including dialectical materialism and historical materialism
2. Explain its significance in the development of Vietnam's state ideology and relevance to other areas of society including history, politics and economics
3. Know that Vietnamese philosophy features elements of syncretism and be able to describe those elements (e.g., Marxism-Leninism, Confucianism, Buddhism, Daoism, etc.)
4. Describe, evaluate and compare different answers to foundational philosophical questions such as "what exists?", "what is knowledge?", and "what is right and wrong?"
5. Understand and assess different approaches to the nature of science and scientific progress

HASS1020 Marxism-Leninism Political Economy (Global Political Economy)

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

1. Demonstrate an understanding of the complexity of how the world is interconnected through the political economy.
2. Develop an informed understanding of conceptual terms and theoretical approaches used in understanding the global economy.
3. Understand the transformation of Vietnam in the context of the global political economy.
4. Cultivate a critical-minded awareness of major trends in the global political economy.
5. Acquire an informed understanding of the rise of China and India and the resulting impacts on Vietnam, ASEAN, and the world.

HASS1030 Scientific Socialism (Politics and Social Change)

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: NA

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Describe and explain the concepts of politics and social change of Vietnam and around the region, and acquire some lexicon of the subject;
2. Understand how politics and political systems are key to socio-economic developments, including but not limited to the Marxist-Leninist views;
3. Understand the ways politics affects economic management, and help determine national success
4. Compare Vietnam's national development with national efforts elsewhere in Asia;

HASS1041/42 Ho Chi Minh Ideology (Vietnam History and Culture II)

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: NA

1. Know the major events, persons, and historical conditions that led to the creation and development of Ho Chi Minh Ideology and engage Ho Chi Minh Ideology as both a historical and living body of thought.
2. Consider the ongoing transformation of Ho Chi Minh thought and its significance in history and for Vietnam's future.
3. Critically review historical artifacts, including textual documents, art, literature, archeology, and accounts of informants and grasp the historical factors and precedents that relate to contemporary issues
4. Gain ability to apply historical and cultural knowledge to understanding and analyzing contemporary problems
5. Present historical evidence-based arguments and conduct probing discussions about challenging historical subjects
6. Explore multiple perspectives about the past, especially the past as understood from the vantage of former historical actors.

HASS1050 History of the Communist Party (Vietnam History and Culture I)

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Know the major events, persons, and historical conditions that led to the creation and development of the Vietnamese Communist Party
2. Critically review historical artifacts, including textual documents, art, literature, archeology, and accounts of informants.
3. Grasp the historical factors and precedents that relate to contemporary issues and gain the ability to apply historical and cultural knowledge to understanding and analyzing contemporary problems
4. Present historical evidence-based arguments
5. Explore multiple perspectives about the past, especially the past as understood from the vantage of former historical actors.

HASS1070 Cross-Cultural Navigation

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Understand the ways in which individual identities, values, and perceptions and biases are shaped by cultures and different forms of life
2. Know the theories and practice related to the impact of culture in our daily ecologies in local and global contexts
3. Identify and understand the intersection of one's own and others' cultural identities
4. Apply knowledge of practice, theory, and personal reflection of different cultures to a particular issue that requires collaboration or cooperation between individuals or groups from different cultural backgrounds

HASS1100 Introduction to International Relations

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: NA

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Know the main actors, structures, and processes of international relations
2. Understand the basic theoretical principles of international relations and compare the competing underlying frameworks on human and social nature
3. Identify the respective objectives of international organizations in international politics, collaboration, and cooperation
4. Explore a case study, problem-solving scenario or dilemma involving international relations and devise a strategy/solution supported by theory and solid argumentation
5. Critically assess alternative strategies and points of view on complex scenarios requiring international relations

ARTS1030 Art Appreciation and Application

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: NA

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of arts and visual arts in general, including their function, and historical, religious, cultural, social, and environmental contexts and relevance;
2. Understand and define the basic principles of arts, visual arts, and design; explain and analyze a work of art from an informed and objective viewpoint, its physical attributes and formal construction;
3. Identify how art works are created and processed;
4. Make a reference to the significance and application of the arts in students' own field of studies and interests;
5. Analyze Vietnam arts and situate Vietnam arts in the global context.

PERF1010 Artistic Performance and Application

Credit: 2

Pre-requisite: N/A

On successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. Show improved skill in their chosen artistic field (e.g., music, dance, theatre, visual arts) and express their creativity and individuality through performance(s).
2. Evaluate and discuss different forms of artistic performance, identifying key elements and techniques, and write reflective assessments on their personal artistic development.
3. Work well with peers to create and perform artistic pieces, and effectively give and receive constructive feedback.
4. Clearly communicate the artistic vision and choices behind their performances both verbally and in writing (if required) and develop their skills in presenting artistic work to an audience, including stage presence and audience engagement.
5. Explore and appreciate a variety of artistic traditions from around the world, with a special focus on Vietnamese culture, and place their own artistic work in a wider cultural and historical context.
6. Plan, organize, and complete an artistic performance project from start to finish, demonstrating good time management and organizational skills.
7. Understand and apply ethical considerations in artistic performance, including respecting intellectual property and cultural sensitivities, and behave professionally during rehearsals, performances, and collaborative projects.

Study Abroad

On successful completion of the study abroad program, students will be able to:

1. Develop skills and self-confidence for interacting with people from a different location and culture
2. Competently navigate living, studying and potentially working in a different location and culture
3. Understand how different backgrounds and cultures impact one another's views, values, behaviours, and biases
4. Reflect on how the experience has produced a global mindset and the values of being a global citizen
5. Build life-long connections and a network of partners for academic study, professional and personal life



6. Academic Opportunities

VinUniversity is a vibrant intellectual community of students and faculty. You can find a broad spectrum of academic opportunities that go beyond your specialization. Double degrees, double majors, and interdisciplinary learning allow you to pursue your two areas of interest in a shorter time. While exchange programs provide an international adventure, research and internship help you bridge theoretical knowledge and practical application.

Start sharing your interest with your academic advisor to see how it may fit into your long-term plan!

6.1. Double Degree and Double Major

The Double Degree planned to be offered to enhance interdisciplinary study at VinUniversity and provide a unique opportunity for exceptional students whose interests cross boundaries.

You can earn a double major (related or unrelated to your first) when the two majors lead toward the same degree within the same college. This leads to a single diploma, with both majors noted on the transcript.

Depending on your unique goals and interests, you can pursue two unrelated majors and enroll in two different degrees in the same College or different Colleges. This leads to the award of two different degrees resulting in two diplomas at the time of graduation.

6.2. Interdisciplinary Learning

How is Interdisciplinary Learning delivered at VinUniversity:

Multidisciplinary Courses/Projects: Courses/projects within courses where students from multiple degree programs work together. It requires either a joint class (i.e. computer science, engineering, and business students), or cross-course projects, or community engagement projects.

Interdisciplinary Minors: A set of minor courses is designed for students of different degree programs to work together. Examples include Robotics, Technopreneur, or Smart Cities.

Industry projects: Experiences designed for small groups of students to work together with an outside company. Individual students could also be immersed in an interdisciplinary group within the company.

6.3. Student Research

Undergraduate students at VinUniversity have opportunities to engage in research with their faculty members. Faculty members post research assistant opportunities on student listservs and research websites. Many of these positions are paid. The university also organizes research workshops for students to learn the fundamentals of conducting research and advance their research skills. 7. Academic Procedures

7.1. Registrar Supporting SharePoint

Registrar SharePoint is a comprehensive and current information source on academic-related procedures, documents, policies, events, and student experiences. Students can see the most recent class schedule, registration policies, registry forms and other necessary information by scanning the QR Code above. The Registrar SharePoint might include, but not be limited to:

- Registration and Academics (Course registration, Academic Regulations, Academic Integrity, Minor Declaration, Program Change, Course exchange, Outbound exchange, etc.)
- Classes, Grades and Evaluation (Courses of instruction, Final examination, Grades, End-of-semester Evaluation, Student Self-evaluation)
- Transcript and Records (Academic transcript, Certifications and Letters, Records Privacy and Access, Personal Information)
- Scheduling Resources (Scheduling policy and procedures, Classroom Inventory, Classroom Rules of Use) Registry Services (Registrar Forms)



7.2. Education Records

The University maintains a record of your academic progress throughout your study time at VinUniversity. This record provides information for academic counseling purposes and serves as the basis for producing grade reports and student transcripts.



7.3. Academic Reports

You can access your grades at the end of each academic semester through the Student Information System at <https://sis.vinuni.edu.vn/>. Course attended, the grades achieved, progression and graduation eligibility, etc. are reported on SIS. This information is confidential and may only be accessed by entering your VinUniversity net ID. The University does not release this information to anyone outside it, except by court order. Within the University, it is available eponymously only to your advisor, your Dean, the Provost, and the instructors of the courses you have registered for, and to the Office of the Registrar for anonymized statistical reporting.

7.4. Co-curricular Record

The Co-curricular Record is separate from the Academic Record, and it lists activities such as participation in student life programs, leadership programs, entrepreneurship programs, and involvement activities that contribute to your student life experience. The Co-curricular Record reflects your non-academic engagement such as career preparation, communication, diversity, global awareness, social responsibility, etc.

The Co-curricular Record supports you in articulating your experience to future employers, job interviews, graduate school application.

7.5. Academic Transcripts

A transcript is a copy of your permanent academic record, duly certified by the Provost, and bearing the embossed seal of the VinUniversity. A transcript is privileged information and is available only upon the written or online request by the student. All requests must be submitted by the student or former student. Requests submitted by parents, or any unauthorized parties will not be honored.

Note that a transcript reflects your current status of a record at the time it is issued. You should ensure that any changes to the transcript are recorded before ordering a transcript.



8. Academic Standards and Policies

8.1. Academic Regulations

Academic Regulations (ARs) aim to govern the progress of students through programs of study leading to degrees awarded by the University. The purpose of the ARs is to provide the mechanism by which academic standards for university awards are ensured and the quality of learning, teaching, and assessment is increased. Before beginning your new academic experience at VinUniversity, carefully read the Regulations by scanning the QR Code below.



8.2. Attendance and Examinations

Class Attendance

It is your responsibility to attend all scheduled classes unless your absence has been approved by the instructors of your classes. You should discuss with the instructor the reason for your absence and to find out what make-up work may be required. You are responsible to read each course syllabus and to comply with the policies as stated.

Final Examinations

Final examinations are scheduled by the Office of Registrar and the dates will be published with the registration dates. It is your responsibility to understand the processes and protocols whilst undertaking exams or assessments. If you cannot take an examination at its scheduled time and your absence is deemed eligible, you may take a make-up examination. You are responsible to read each course syllabus and to comply with the policies as stated.



8.3. Leave of Absence

8.3.1. Leave of Absence or Withdrawal

You may encounter circumstances that require you to take time away from the University. In those situations, you can request a leave of absence (LOA) or a Withdrawal.

An LOA or a withdrawal may impact your scholarship, financial aid, or academic progress. As such, you are encouraged to discuss your request with the Academic Advisor, Office of Finance and Accounting, Student Affairs Management Office, and Office of Registrar to understand its impact.

8.3.2. Resumption of Studies after a Leave of Absence

When returning from an LOA, you must complete and submit to your Academic Advisor the Application Form before being permitted to enroll or register for classes. The form must be accompanied by documentation that explains what progress has taken place in your absence that would enable you to be successful upon return. You will be notified of a final decision by the Office of Registrar.

If you do not return to the academic program immediately after the approved leave, and you do not promptly obtain an extension of your LOA and is not placed on an Involuntary LOA, your student record is made inactive. To return to academic work at a later time, you must formally reapply for admission through the Office of Admissions.

8.4. Academic Integrity

Absolute integrity is expected of every VinUniversity student in all academic undertakings. Integrity entails a firm adherence to a set of values, and the values most essential to an academic community are grounded on the concept of honesty with respect to the intellectual efforts of oneself and others. Academic integrity is expected not only in formal coursework situations but in all University relationships and interactions connected to the educational process, including the use of University resources.

A VinUniversity student's submission of work for academic credit indicates that the work is the student's own. All outside assistance should be acknowledged, and the student's academic position truthfully reported at all times. In addition, VinUniversity students have a right to expect academic integrity from each of their peers.

A. General Responsibilities

1. A student shall in no way misrepresent his or her work.
2. A student shall in no way fraudulently or unfairly advance his or her academic position.
3. A student shall refuse to be a party to another student's failure to maintain academic integrity.
4. A student shall not in any other manner violate the principle of academic integrity.

B. Examples

The following actions are examples of activities that violate the Code of Academic Integrity and subject their actors to proceedings under the Code.

1. Knowingly representing the work of others as one's own.
2. Using, obtaining, or providing unauthorized assistance on examinations, papers, or any other academic work.
3. Fabricating data in support of laboratory or fieldwork.
4. Forging a signature to certify completion of a course assignment or a recommendation to graduate school.
5. Unfairly advancing one's academic position by hoarding or damaging library materials.
6. Misrepresenting one's academic accomplishments.

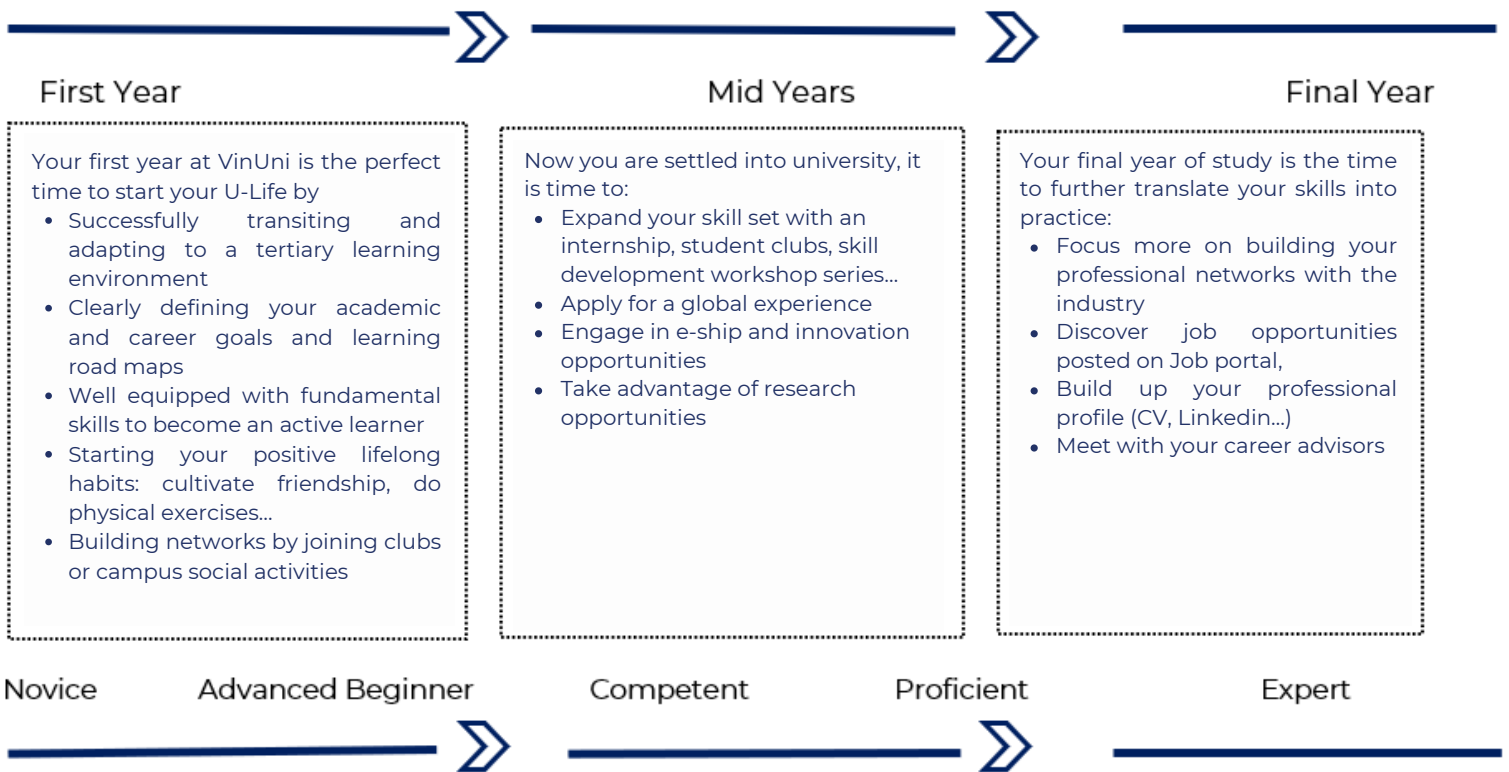

Convocation Day

At our campus, all faculty and staff long for this moment and make necessary preparation to welcome students into a very special journey of a lifetime.

11. Global Exchange Programs

11.1. Outbound Student Exchange Programs

Undergraduate students at VinUniversity can apply for, and participate in, the Outbound Student Exchange Program (OSEP) which is a short-term study program to study at a partner university overseas. We are working with leading universities in the world to plan the establishment of exchange study programs for our VinUni students. Current undergraduate students can choose to participate in either of the different exchange forms such as:

Student Exchange on a reciprocal basis

In this arrangement, if one VinUniversity student participates in the exchange semester(s) at the partner university, one student from the partner university will also attend VinUni for an equal duration of time.

Students who are accepted into this exchange program will attend one of VinUni's partner institutions for one or two regular semesters (Fall and/or Spring). The students do not have to pay tuition fees at the host institution. Students will continue to pay tuition fees to VinUni at the same rate as when they study full time at VinUniversity at the time. However, they are responsible for meeting all other costs of the exchange program. Some of these costs include accommodation, airfare, and transportation, health and travel insurance, living costs, visa costs, books, facilities access (if any). Additional financial support may be available at the time of application and will be informed by VinUniversity. The number of exchange slots at each host institution is regulated by the agreement between VinUniversity and that partner university.



Self-arranged exchange program/externally funded program

VinUniversity students who would like to study at a university that does not have an exchange agreement with VinUniversity can choose to personally plan and finance their studies abroad. It will be their responsibility to apply to the university abroad as well as to ensure that all the practical matters are taken care of. Students will apply directly to the institution or apply for an external scholarship/grant program. Most universities accept students directly as “Visiting/Exchange Students” on a fee-paying basis or scholarship basis. In this case, the applications normally do not go through VinUniversity, and admission decisions are made by the host institutions or the external scholarship programs. Before committing to a program, students should carefully research the program and get a full understanding of the Leave of Absence policy or the credit transfer policy at VinUniversity. Students need to get approval in advance from VinUniversity before joining this program. Students can apply for the credit transfer when they return to VinUniversity, and the review adheres to the present protocol and process.

11.2. Integrated Degree Programs

(Based on agreements between VinUni and a partner university)

Students who are accepted into this program will have the opportunity to earn two bachelor's degrees or a bachelor's and a master's degree – one from VinUni and the second degree from a partner university abroad.

The program consists of two phases in which VinUni students will study Phase 1 at VinUni and Phase 2 at a partner university overseas. At the end of both phases, they will get two degrees, one from VinUni and another from the partner university. The modules are often in the form of 3+2, 4+1, 3.5+2 for Bachelor's – Master's programs and 2+2 or 2.5 +1.5 for Bachelor's – Bachelor's programs.

Fast-tracking students take classes towards their Master's while earning their Bachelor's degree, which helps them save significant costs of attendance and enable them to graduate up to 12 months sooner. In addition, accelerated degree pathways are intended to build on the momentum students currently have as an undergraduate in an effort to create a seamless progression toward higher degree attainment, in the most efficient and cost-effective manner possible.

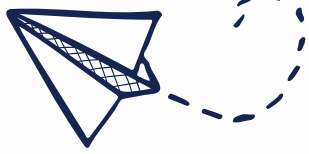

Double Rooms (average area of 21m²)



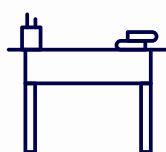

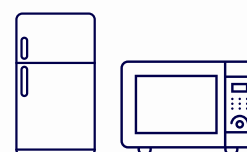

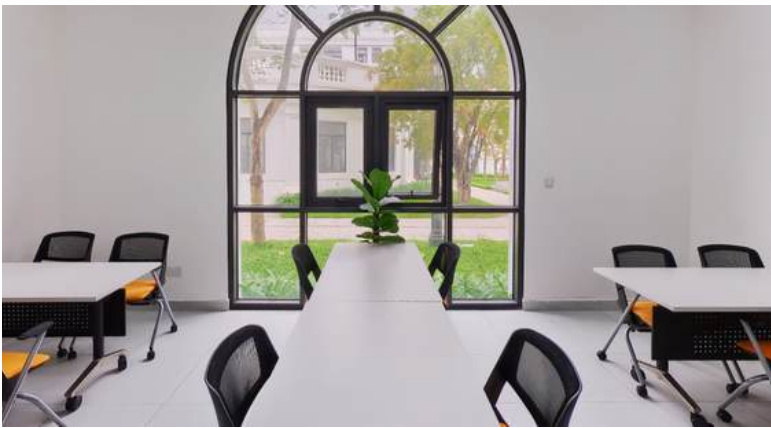


Access Key: Resident accesses the room using their Student ID card.

13.1.2. Residence Services

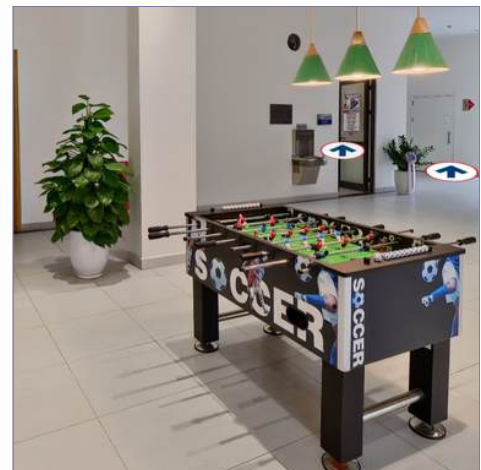
Recreation Room and Social Hub

At VinUniversity, you can avail of a comfortable recreation room, perfect for relaxing and chilling out. We are committed to making VinUniversity your home away from home, whether you commute to or reside in campus accommodation. To help this, we provide custom-built areas for you to chill out, relax, and enjoy themselves. These common spaces are not limited to only residents but also serve all university students. The area is located on the ground floor (Level 1) of the dormitory.



Reading room

Reading Room reinvigorates its legacy as a site of social learning and a center for public intellectual life. It is a cozy, intimate space to linger and study, a gathering spot for meetings, and home to collaborative programs, projects, and conversations.



Canteen and Cafeteria

The cafeteria is located at level 1, Building E, operated by an outside vendor. They provide breakfast, lunch and dinner. More information can be found in the Residential Life Guidelines.

You can also find most of the services you need in daily life in your dormitories, such as laundry facility, vending machine, cooking area at JC, level 2.

13.1.3 Building Services

We maintain various channels to support you during your time at the residence.

Residential Life Office

Residential Life Office is responsible for the overall functioning of VinUniversity's dormitory.

Resident Assistants (RAs) are VinUniversity students who work for the Residential Life Office and provide support and facilitate the resident community. The staff of the Residential Life Office and/or RAs will be around in case of any inquiries, assistance or recommendations needed.

Faculty-in-residence also has an important role in Residential Life. They live in a dorm and share students their living experiences. This is the opportunity to provide a seamless transition between the classroom and the residence hall environment.

Maintenance

Our maintenance team is on duty 24/7 to support you with the issues of technique. You can report the issue through the Residential Life Office or directly to the maintenance hotline for emergencies (please refer to Page 4 of this booklet).

Security

Security staff works on-site 24/7 and they can assist with all aspects of security. Please note that you are also responsible for the security of your accommodation. You should always ensure that you close and lock all doors and windows when leaving the room. Personal belongings should be stored safely and securely.

13.1.4 Care of Residential Property

Room Inspections and Student Charges

Residential Life Office inspects all student rooms and suites at least once during the academic year. Students who damage any part of the suite or its furnishings will be charged the full cost, including labor, repainting, replacing, and repairing of damaged areas and property.

Prohibited items such as cooking appliances, pets, alcohol, space heaters, or weapons will be confiscated and reported. The room will be inspected to ensure compliance with VinUniversity policies and fire regulations.

Students are expected to keep their dorm rooms, their personal spaces, shared and common spaces in their suite, and the common areas in the dorm clean and tidy. Students will be charged with a cleaning fee in case of an excessive mess and dirt.

Collective Responsibility

It is expected that students take responsibility for damages (accidental or deliberate) that they cause to any part of a University building or its furnishings. In cases where individuals do not take responsibility for damages to common areas or private rooms, a shared group-charge will be applied.

13.1.5 Resident Assistant Program

Think about making a difference on campus by being a Resident Assistant (RA)! The RA role plays a vital part in building the community in the residential halls. RAs are student leaders on campus who are trained to create welcoming residential environments on campus through programming, one-to-one resident outreaches, and informative bulletin boards. If you are interested in this program, you must attend an information session to receive an application for the RA position. Information sessions will review requirements for application, roles, and responsibilities of staff members, timeline, important dates, and more.

13.2. Transportation and Parking

Campus Transportation

Within the campus, students are encouraged to walk or cycle between the Dormitory and Main Building or other buildings due to a close proximity. If the student prefers using motorbikes within the campus area, the student must follow the traffic rules according to Student Code of Conduct Policy and Procedure.

If any student needs a special arrangement because of a disability or emergency, an electric vehicle (tuk-tuk) with a driver can be offered to transport the student within the campus area.

Dormitory Parking

Students are allowed to park their vehicles at the Dormitory Parking. Registration for free monthly parking is required. Guests of students can park at the Dormitory Parking area, and parking fee might incur. A visitor card will be issued at the gate for students' guests.

14.1. Medical Services

15. Code of conduct

All students are expected to respect and value the rights of others, property, and environment; and conduct themselves as responsible citizens. There are 7 groups of misconduct which are prohibited both on- and off-campus. VinUniversity considers the off campus conducts of students when they participate activities/ events which are organized, hosted by VinUniversity or other institutions or organizations who are in partnership with VinUniversity.

1. **Prohibited substances use** (alcohol, drugs, cigarettes, etc.) **and gambling**
2. **Assault, harassment** (abuse, humiliation, swearing & profanity, threatening, sexual violence etc., including either verbal or non-verbal)
3. **Discrimination and racism**
4. **Dangerous materials** (firearms, weapons, and explosives)
5. **Inappropriate use of university and community property**
6. **Information technology, cyber space & social network**
7. **Compliance with national law, and university rules and regulation**

Individuals who participate in directly or indirectly of any of above violations will be subject to strict disciplinary action as described in the Student Code of Conduct Policy and Procedure which you can find details at VinUni Student SharePoint Site:

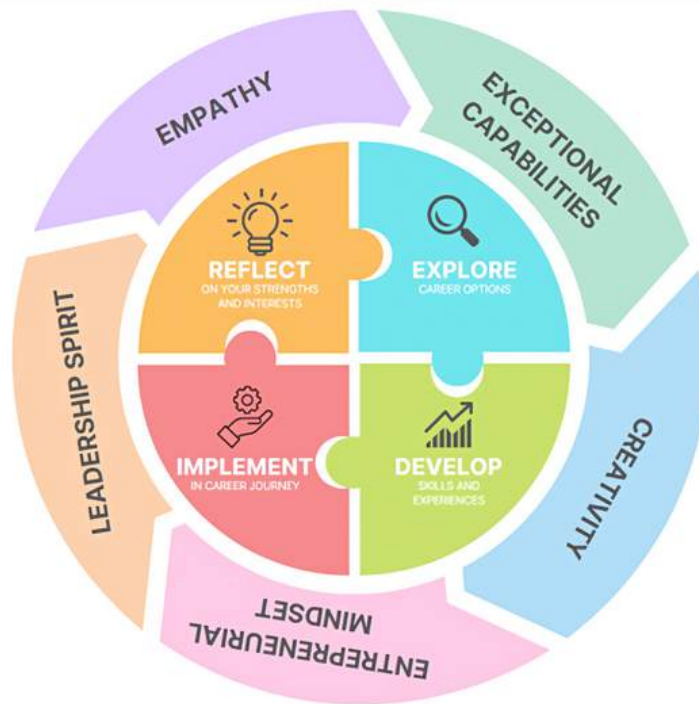
